





Figure 1—Fuel Gauge Schematic Wiring Diagram

52 YEARS AND STILL RUNNING

I bought a 1968 GMC in 1970. Today this truck is still running and used on occasion to go to the dump or take on light duty pick up jobs. Over the years it has required some maintenance. At or about 150,000 miles a new motor, transmission rebuild, and new paint. Other repairs or changes were, starter, alternator, wiper motor (twice) water pump, and some new upholstery/carpet, and a 1972 running gear to go from 6 wheel bolt pattern to 5 wheel bolt pattern and from drum to disc brakes. This truck has a 396ci with a turbo 400, with stock bucket seats. It is a rare model. I have only seen one other like it. I paid \$2,265.00 when I got it with 33,000 miles on it. Not sure how many miles on it now but I think around 200,000. It has always been on the road except for the short down times for new engine, transmission, paint and drive train change over. It has been one of the most reliable vehicles I have ever owned.
