

#### ANOTHER TRAILER TOWING EXPERIENCE

We were on our way to the 4-Cylinder Tour in McCall, Idaho. Generally, I would be concerned about the running of the 1926 Chev, or the trailer we were towing, but not the tow rig. As we started pulling up Snoqualmie Pass on I-90, the engine speed continued to drop until we were going 30 to 35 mph as we crested the top of the pass. As we slowed, our van refused to kick down into a lower gear, and I indicated to MG that we may be turning around. Then I realized we had AAA towing for 100 miles, so we decided to continue until we were 100 miles from home and then make a decision. Things improved slightly. After making the pass, we limped on over the additional passes and flats to McCall, Idaho. Figuring it was the transmission, I made an appointment with a transmission shop in McCall. They tested several engine related items and found the Catalytic Converter plugged. I was left with no choice but to have a new converter installed.

I could understand that a plugged converter could cause the engine to falter, but would never have thought it would prevent the transmission from shifting down. A dishonest transmission shop could have claimed it was the transmission to the tune of \$2500 to \$3700. Instead, the testing was less than \$300 and the new Cat, about \$300, for a total of \$600.

One thing I should have thought to do was to manually shift down to take the stress off of the engine. As a side note, emissions testing ends in Seattle on January 1, 2020, as air pollution criteria have been met in Seattle and the surrounding area.

#### **Chevrolet Dominates the 2019 Indianapolis 500 Race**

In May of this year, a Chevy Indy Car driven by Frenchman Simon Pagenaud finished in first place and four Chevroletpowered cars finished in the top six places at the Indianapolis 500 Race. Simon Pagenaud arrived at Indianapolis Motor Speedway this month with his job on the line and rumors swirling around that Alexander Rossi could soon replace him at Team Penske. The Frenchman is leaving with a pair of wins and an assurance from Roger Penske himself that he isn't going anywhere.


In a head-to-head duel for the ages, Pagenaud defeated none other than Rossi with a dramatic pass on the penultimate lap, then holding on the rest of the way to hand Penske his 18th win in "The Greatest Spectacle in Racing." Pagenaud and Rossi swapped the lead five times over the final 13 laps, and the margin of victory was a mere 0.2086 seconds -- the seventh-closest finish in the 103 years of the race!

In addition to winning this years race, the Indianapolis 500 Pace Car was a Chevrolet Corvette and there have been 30 Chevrolet brand Indianapolis 500 Pace Cars since 1948. Sixteen of those 30 Chevy Pace Cars have been Corvettes!
