The Northwest Meet will be July 18 - 20, 2023 at Packwood, Washington. 

Handyman Harmonic Balance Repair

There's always something that needs repair for my old, high-mileage '53 Chevy wagon. As of late, I've been noticing the lower pulley on my engine crankshaft wobbling, and slowly getting worse. I learned from my Chevrolet Shop Manual (for cars 1949 - 53), that the pulley is an intricate part of the crankshaft damper, called a Harmonic Balance. I had never replaced one, so I read up and proceeded to learn as I did the repair.

I drained and removed the radiator and hoses. 4 of the bolts holding the radiator to the support frame also mount the horns, so I removed them out of the way, (no need to disconnect the wiring from the terminal strip). At this point, the shop manual said to remove the bumper face bar, disconnect the parking lamps, remove the lower catch plate, front fender skirt, air duct baffle, radiator grill and filler panel baffle. THEN, remove the engine support side mounting bolts and jack up the engine 1/2" to clear the radiator support frame for attaching puller J-1287!



So I chose to approach things differently and removed all of the bolts securing the radiator support frame: to do this, I had to remove the battery and tray to reach the bolts on the passenger side. I then removed the 2 bolts and 4" flat bar with rubber on the underside of the support frame.



Next, I removed 2 bolts holding the center bracket attached to the front fender skirt.



I now lifted the radiator support frame with the top wiring harness as an assembly, about 4", and braced it it with a short 2x4 piece of wood. (No need to do all of the other steps as shown in the book, unless my '53 design is different from the earlier models). At this point, I could reach the Harmonic Balancer head on.



I drove to O'Reilly's Auto Parts and rented the Timing Gear Removal Tool kit (67010); actually, it's free as long as you return it within 48 hours.

I had to buy a couple of $3/8 \times 2 1/2''$ coarse thread bolts that were shorter to fit in the limited space in front of the Harmonic Balancer. I then used a large crescent wrench to remove the Harmonic Balancer.



My old Harmonic Balancer was not reusable as the pully was warped.



I bought a good used Harmonic Balancer from Old Car Parts in Portland, OR for \$75. I then shipped it off to Damoer Dudes in California. They rebuilt it for \$220. I also replaced the gasket and oil seal for the timing cover, fan belt, and the top radiator hose. Total cost with shipping was just over \$400.

Fuel Issues

The Filling Station

Today's fuel has a lower boiling point and is prone to causing vapor lock (turning fuel into vapor before reaching the carburetor). When possible, use non-ethanol fuel to prevent vapor lock. Non-ethanol is better for operation and much better when a vehicle is not run on a regular basis. The fuel is much more stable than ethanol fuel and won't turn to a gummy mess in just a few months.

Ethanol fuel can cause a warm carburetor to evaporate the fuel in the bowl, causing it to be hard to start on the next time it is needed. The extra expense of non-ethanol fuel is really worth the cost in our older cars. It will save you maintenance issues and frustration in the future.

These early engines are very simple and, if properly maintained, should operate smoothly and start easily.
