ACTIVITIES--John Valiton is looking at the Military Museum south of Tacoma for an April Tour. He would appreciate any suggestions of tours especially to the south and east.

CLUB STORE--Don Comstock brought the following items to sell at the meeting at bargain prices: \$2 VCCA years pins, \$3 Logo Pins, \$10 embroidered back patches, \$3 name badges, and \$7 metal license plate frames. He also asked members for ideas for the Store to buy.

PROGRAM--Dick Olsen shared information and photos from his restoration of a 1930's Chevy Roadster. Dick found the car on Craigslist. The car with 40,000 miles had been in a barn for 20+ years. It had been extensively damaged in an accident, so Dick essentially rebuilt it from the ground (chassis) up. Dick gave an interesting presentation about his search for parts and steps he took to restore it. The photos detailed his progress and efforts. The end result was a beautiful, bright green Roadster, which he sold in 2021. The members asked Dick several questions about his work and the car (only 10 1930 Roadsters registered with VCCA at that time). Members also thanked Dick for the skilled work he had done for other Club members on their car restorations.

NEW BUSINESS--Dot Ziegler graciously volunteered to take the lead in preparing a PSR gift basket for the 2024 NW Meet. **Please contact Dot if you have ideas for a theme, can help her, and/or donate items for the PSR 2024 Basket. Thank you.** Sallie Comstock presented a motion to use \$50 from our treasury to help fund the basket, and the motion was unanimously passed.

A brief break was taken for treats and a free raffle of items donated by Bill Barker and Bob Stamnes.

The second part of the program was an informative presentation, accompanied by slides, by Tom Taricco about the steps taken by the **2025 NW Location (Phase 2) Committee** (Tom Taricco, Bob Reller, Dave Haddock, Don Comstock) to recommend a site for the meet. PSR members unanimously accepted the committee's recommendation of the **Doming with the testepy the new tree of the recommendation** as the first choice for lodging with the testepy the new tree of the recommendation. The committee was thanked for their extensive work and time de-



2025 NW Meet Presentation - FEB 10,2024



After six months hard work by two volunteer Committees (Phase 1: Bill Baker, Dave Haddock, Bob Reller, Ken Scott, and Tom Taricco; Phase 2: Don Comstock, Dave Haddock, Bob Reller, and Tom Taricco), PSR-VCCA membership unanimously approved the 2025 NW Meet and gave the go ahead to proceed. The site and property selection for the 2025 NW Meet was presented and accepted. The Meet date has not been set as contract negotiations with the property is in progress. <u>Tradition mandates that the name of the site and property not be announced until the 2024 NW Meet, being held this June, at The Dalles, Oregon.</u> In the meantime, mum's the word.

A PowerPoint presentation was given to attending members (in-person and on Zoom) explaining the selection process, time lines (both completed and still to be completed), and justification for the recommended site and property. It was emphasized that we have lots of work still ahead of us and that participation from our Club members, as well as other District 3 Club members, is most welcome and needed.

Upcoming April Tour

PSR-VCCA Spring Tour 2024 McChord Air History Museum April 17th, tour reserved

The PSR-VCCA spring tour destination will be the McChord Air Base History Museum, south of Tacoma. The museum has 3 sites on base: the museum building, a restoration hanger, and an outdoor display of aircraft. Our club will meet at Jack's BBQ, in Lakewood for lunch at 11:30 am. Then at 12:30 pm, we will travel to the McChord Air Base Visitor's Center, for entry to the base.

LOGISTICS: The tour is free, BUT to visit the base requires a VISITOR'S PASS: This means providing proof of I.D. with either an ENHANCED Washington State Driver's License, or CURRENT PASSPORT. Also required are proof of CAR REGIS-TRATION and PROOF OF INSURANCE. Note: the VISITOR'S PASS can only be acquired on the day of the visit at the Visitor's Center, located off I-5, on Bridgeport Way SW. We can do this as a group after lunch, with the tour starting about 1 pm.

Driving to Jake's will have to be in separate groups from Seattle, the east side, and south of Tacoma. I have routes that would avoid travel on I-5, if any club member needs advice. The exit off of I-5 for Jack's BBQ and entrance to the air base is Bridgeport Way SW, south of Tacoma. Jack's address is, 12115 Pacific Hwy SW, Lakewood Wa. 98499.






When stranded on the shoulder, with a tire that's just gone flat, It might be quick to change it, But it depends where you're at.



From The Glovebox

Last month a club member called me about having starting problems with their car. While I tried to diagnose it over the phone, we failed to follow any kind of logical process. That left us with a slew of causes. As a result, I drew up this simple flow chart and took it with me the next day when I visited the owner and examined the car. As I have found in the past, when you are trying to fix a problem, most times it is not worthwhile to "jump ahead" and assume a solution. You need to be logical and proceed down a path that eliminates various issues one-by-one. Then as you progress, the number of options for the troublemaker becomes less and less. Finally narrowing it down to ONLY one or two causes is when you make real progress. I'm sure that there are lots of troubleshooting diagrams out there for people to use, but this one was fairly short and easy to follow, and it did lead us to a solution:

For many people, WD-40 means lubrication. A hinge squeaks or a bolt sticks in its hole, and you give it a shot from the familiar can. The formulation is a blend of high-quality, light-body lubricating oils propelled out of the can with CO2.
