


LESSONS LEARNED - from Bill Barker

Have Your Insurance With JC Taylor? Take Their Road Hazard Insurance? You Need To Read This.

Received my renewal today and in it was an offer to provide roadside assistance by Cross Country Motor Club, Inc. for \$12, so I signed up for it thinking I could use it if AAA didn't show up. But then I tried to find a telephone number for this company. After 5 calls, a lady with another Farmer's company gave me a number for Cross Country Motor Club, Inc.. I called the number and they were closed and said to call back Monday. Now you have to ask yourself "How much good is this roadside policy going to do me if I cannot get anyone by phone?"

Then I wondered if this company even had anyone in our area to service us if we could get ahold of them. Well, I found a lot of reviews. Overall they had 2 stars out of 5. The 2 star rating may be biased on the high side as most ratings were one star with a 5 star rating thrown in every 5 or 10 one star ratings. There were basically no 2, 3 or 4 star ratings. Think someone could be padding the reviews?

One reviewer did provide the following information which may help you better understand the situation and the poor reviews: "Understand, they are like Uber of the Tow world, they are called and then they dispatch a local company to come pick up your vehicle. So basically they get a cut for just having contacts to get the fastest tow for your location."

Note: Since I first wrote this article, I have received my final renewal papers which included the emergency road service contact number. It is 1 (800) 817-1188 in case you dare use it.

Thanks anyway, but I think I will call AAA first when I need roadside assistance even if it may mean waiting awhile.

FROM THE HALF-POUND JAR

Washington State's Distracted Driving Law

Did you know that when it comes to distracted driving, Washington State has one of the most restrictive laws in the nation?? On July 23, 2017, Washington banned drivers from using all handheld personal devices while behind the wheel and even when they stop at a traffic sign/signal or are stuck in slow-moving traffic!!

IT IS AGAINST THE LAW TO:

- Hold a cell phone or electronic device in your hand
- Use your fingers to type, send, read, view, access, web browse, transmit, save or retrieve email, text messages, instant messages, photos or other data
- Watch a video

EXCEPTIONS:

• To contact emergency services you can use a single finger-swipe or button push to activate, deactivate or initiate a function when your vehicle is off the road, in park

WHAT IS LEGAL

• Hands-free use of personal electronic devices is legal (however using your device hands-free is no safer than using it hand-held).

PENALTIES

- First ticket = \$136 fine AND the ticket is reported to your insurance company
- Second ticket within five years = Fine doubles

DANGEROUSLY DISTRACTED

- These "Secondary Offenses" carry a fine of \$99
- Secondary offense handed out when you are pulled over for committing a traffic violation, such as crossing the centerline or following too close, while you were distracted by any non-driving activity.
- Examples include eating, spilling your coffee, holding a pet on your lap, putting on makeup, shaving.

Avoid distracted driving actions and be a safer driver.

And be sure to tell your kids and grandkids!!!
