

NORTH WEST MEET OVERVIEW

What to bring: VCCA Passports, Discovery Pass, water bottle, chair, cooler for incidentals RV Parking: Follow VCCA Signage to Hotel Portico to check-in and receive your RV spot assignment. At that time, you can pick up your meet packet. After you unload your classic Chevrolet, it will have a parking spot with the other classics. (PLEASE DO NOT pull into the RV Park without checking in first)

Hauler & ModernVehicle Parking: Follow VCCA Signage to Hotel Portico with your hauler to receive your Hauler parking and unloading information. At that time you can register for your room & pick up your meet packet. After you unload your classic Chevrolet, it will have a parking spot with the other classics but your modern car will have to be parked in the general hotel parking.

Classic Car Parking: Registered classic cars will be parked in decade order in their own separate area. If you are driving your classic to the meet, upon arrival PLEASE follow instructions and VCCA signage to the hotel portico where you can register for your room and pick up your meet packet and parking assignment.

Wednesday: Check-in Hotel and or RV Park. Meet Registration opens at 6 p.m. in Lobby

Thursday: Registration, Women's Luncheon (Hippy Costumes will be judged), Self-Guided Tours, Social

TEE-SHIRTS

The Tee-Shirts will be unisex shirts and can be purchased with a stylized meet logo by preorder only. All shirts will be either tie-dyed rainbow color OR navy blue with "PEACE, LOVE

& CHEVROLET" screened in White on the back. A smaller logo will be on the left front. See the registration form for sizes and prices. Shirt (s) must be ordered on the registration form; there will be no on-site sales.

NATIONAL VEHICLE JUDGING & CERTIFICATIONS

Friday, August 27, 2022

The types of judging for this meet are listed below and all vehicles being judged or certified must be 1997 or older. All cars being judged/certified must pass a field entrance check and have a working fire extinguisher.

NATIONAL VCCA JUDGING CLASSES

JUNIOR:	Any qualified VCCA vehicle that has not received a previous first Junior award. A vehicle being shown for the first time – or by a new owner for the first time.
SENIOR:	Vehicle MUST have won a first Junior award at a previous Nationally sanctioned Meet.

PRESERVATION: Vehicle has won a first Senior award at a Nationally sanctioned Meet.

NATIONAL CERTIFICATION CLASSES

HPOCF: (Historical Preservation of Original Chevrolet Features): A member's original Chevrolet that is totally original or retaining significant original features in at least two (2) of four (4) areas which are as follows:

Interior Exterior Engine Chassis/Undercarriage
(NOT for those vehicles that have been neglected and/or look as if they are in need of restoration or significant repair) cont. on page 7

CDPC: (Chevrolet Drivers' Participation Certification): A certification, non-competitive class for members who don't want to have their car judged in the traditional manner. Vehicles are eligible if they have not won a National point judging award and are not modified/personalized. Judges will focus on:

Interior Exterior Engine Chassis

The following are exceptions that will not disqualify the vehicle from certifications: seat belts, turn signals, stop lights, sealed beamed/halogen headlights, radial tires mounted on original style wheels, radio upgrades, electric upgrades, air conditioning,

PERSONALIZED CHEVROLET CHAPTER

PCC: Judging requires membership in the Personalized Chevrolet Chapter as well as the VCCA. (Visit **www.pcc.vcca.org** for more information.) This allows modified vehicles to be judged. Vehicles MUST have a Chevy motor and a Chevy built body.

- 4. Type Your Information on the Registration Form (please use the tab key to move box to box). On the order form (Page 2) enter 'QTY', press the

Note: If you having your car judged, please 'Enter Total Judging Fees' (from page 1) at the bottom of Page 2 touch the '**Tab Key'** and the 'EVENT TOTAL' will be updated.



CAN YOU IDENTIFY THIS CARBURATOR SETUP????



Last month we showed you a picture of something. Sorry to say we put it upside down. No one responded to what it was so I will tell you. It is a picture of a 28 intake manifold put on upside down allowing for a down draft carburetor. The carburetor is a w1 carter off of a 32. I have driven about 500 miles with this setup. I much prefer it to the updraft carburetors originally used. I get the gas to it with an electric fuel pump with about 2 to 3 pounds of pressure, no problem. Feel free to ask me questions.


