For the program, Rod interviewed Dave Haddock about his 1951 Chevrolet convertible. Dave set the mood by sharing Dinah Shore's "See the USA in your Chevrolet." In 1959, Dave's dad, a mechanic at the local Chevrolet dealership, bought the car for \$50 to use as a daily driver to commute to work 8 blocks away! The car has been in the family ever since. Dave shared some memories and wonderful family photos of the car, including pulling a sled in the car in Colorado snow (more photos can be found in the September 2021) G&D). Starting at the age of 7, Dave began to "assist" his father on car repairs, including frequent trips to the junkyard and Saturday work in the dealer's shop. In 1967, the car and driving was passed on to his 16 year old sister. She painted it yellow which allowed Dave's parents to easily keep track of the car and his sister's driving. Dave used the car on his 1984 move from Billings, MT to Seattle, WA. As they traveled toward Seattle at 55-60 mph, the car would heat up and slip out of third gear. This led to help from Dave Folsom (235guy blogspot) and connections to our PSR-VCCA Club. 1984 was also the year that the car was sanded, and the car color was changed from yellow to the sparkle of Fathom Green. Other memorable moments that Dave shared included getting the Hard Luck Award at the Bellingham Northwest Meet, problems with the installation of the Pertronix Ignition kit, and driving his daughter, Alison, and her husband, Mason Perino, on their 2019 wedding day. No wonder Dave calls the car a treasure with its 64 years of family memories. We thank Dave for sharing his car and his memories with us.

AREA 3 DIRECTOR'S REPORT - MAY 2023





SHORT & SWEET TOUR (APRIL 8TH)







"Be Careful, Read All Instructions First"

Tyre Cleaner Warning

In February this year, a good friend of mine, and long-time VCCA member in Brisbane, Australia, had an unfortunate mishap. He was cleaning up his cars (Chevrolets). The tires on one of them "was getting a little brown". So he used a common local tire product called "So Easy" to clean and brighten them. It looked so good, that he did two additional cars -- and then the next day decided to do all of them a second time. The end result was very satisfying. For reference the product is made by a USA company called C.R.C. prod-ucts. You may have heard of them.

A few days later all of the skin on his hands started to peel off and he lost a couple of layers over the next 7 weeks. As of today (April 11th) his hands are very tender. He can't effectively work on his cars while he needs to wear rubber gloves just to type an email to me. His hands haven't seemed to improve very much within this time.

The only warning on the label of the 4 litre bottle was "Do not use it on 2 wheel vehicles". After he started to lose skin he looked up their safety data sheet. It says "for prolonged use, wear gloves as it causes defatting of the skin." He has now tried to get some assistance from C.R.C. and they tell him there is nothing they can do in Australia until they hear from their U.S. chemists and technicians.

This product doesn't seem to be available in America and the container states it is made and packaged in Australia. Yet C.R.C. Management there has told him that they have emailed previous photos to America for their chemists to look at and that there is nothing else that they can do for him until they hear from the USA chemists. This does seem strange considering the product is only made in Australia.

He admits that it's a little late to read the Safety Data Sheet now but everyone should take it as a warning to pay attention to this on just about any product. And the only warning that was noted "not to use it on two-wheel vehicles" made him think that it was a fairly innocuous product. Even though this is a product only available in Australia, please take it as a warning on ANY product that you use on steel or rubber.

UPDATE 4/10

My friend spoke to the B.D.M. of C.R.C. Australia yesterday and the information from previous C.R.C. representatives was incorrect. The So Easy product is a solely Australian designed and manufactured product and was offered to C.R.C. America years ago and they didn't proceed with it as they thought there wasn't a big enough demand for it. Subsequently Armor All copied the formula (according to C.R.C in Australia) and started producing it and selling it in America. He has some Armor All there and there are no warnings on it but he feels that it would most likely cause the same problems. He has now researched Armor All's safety data sheet and it appears to be of a different makeup but could possibly cause similar problems.

CRC Australia only uses a chemist in New Zealand who is currently on leave so no one is really handling his case. He finally was given this information by the BDM yesterday who told him the person who gave him the incorrect information was only a salesman who didn't know what he was talking about.

So he went for his third visit to a doctor yesterday and was given a referral - only to be told the first available appointment was the 26th of July!!! But fortunately while he was reading my email later that day at home, the doctor's office rang with a cancellation at 8.20 am the next morning. He's hopeful that they'll read the safety data sheet and write a report that favors his medical issues.

UPDATE 4/12

The meeting with the doctors was productive. They confirmed the cause and effect of the tire cleaning product. They took many tests of him for evaluation. A couple of days afterwards, he got the test results. Unbeknownst to him, he has a low level of psoriasis. This condition was then exasperated by the chemical makeup of the prod-uct.

UPDATE 4/15

By applying some special ointment and wearing rubber gloves all day, he has finally seen some positive changes after almost 60 days since the first use. So, I have my fingers crossed that his improvement will continue. All of us car guys need to pay heed to the WARNINGS that are on nearly each and every product that we use in our hobby. Even the BRAND NAME items could potentially have disastrous ramifications. And one other safety tip is to always use any chemical product in a well ventilated space. That means opening the garage door even in the winter. Don't say that I didn't tell you so!!
