


We hope you can join us at 9:30am on-line via Zoom or in-person at Kent Sullivan's Shop Saturday, September 10th





Dear Former Big Sky Tour Participants/Inquirers/Or anyone interested in joining us for a tour:

All-Cylinder Tour

As many of you may know, we in the Big Sky Region had decided last summer that we would forego a 2022 tour. However, after speaking with several VCCA members at the recent tour in Porterville, and conducting our annual meeting here in Montana, we changed our minds. Quite a few westerners, especially, seemed to be passing on Bowling Green, so we thought this might be something closer, to do.

We are not advertising in the G&D, as it would have been too late to get in before the August issue. We would appreciate your sharing this information with anyone you think might be interested. The final route and accommodations are not firmed up, but the following will be the general itinerary. Of course, all life is subject to change! This will be a Passport tour.

We are planning to tour in Idaho. We have covered much of the western part of MT previously, and the eastern part is a long way to go. We once went to Fort Peck, and it was 500 plus miles, one way, for us.

Planned dates: September 20-23, 2022. Arrive in Hamilton, MT, on Sept. 20, to be ready to leave there Sept. 21, AM. Or join us in ID. Hamilton to North Fork, ID, to Shoup and Ebenezer Bar, and back to Salmon, mostly on US 93. Us 93 to Challis. Spend night in Challis. Challis Hot Springs is nearby, for those interested. Approx. 193 miles. Thursday, drive ID 75 to Stanley, Ketchum, to US 20 to Carey. US 20/26/93 to Arco, via Craters of the Moon Nat. Mon. Spend night in Arco. FYI - On this drive we cross Galena Summit, 8,701 feet. Approx. 194 miles. Friday's route would take us back on US 93 to Salmon to Hamilton. Approx. 220 miles. Total, 607 miles. Approx. The route might be done in reverse order.

If this is something you or someone you know would be interested in, please let us know as soon as possible. I will have a registration form, at your request, and more detailed information about accommodations, etc. Thank you for considering joining us.
