

**Update:** In January I broadcast the message below to Puget Sound members and asked for an email response. Today, as I prepare this for the TC, I have already received about 50 responses and all but one preferred to receive the TC by email. This information will be presented to the membership at the February meeting. Thank you all for your cooperation on this matter. **You do not need to respond to this letter again**. I am publishing this letter in the TC to keep <u>all</u> members abreast of any upcoming changes.

# Should the Puget Sound Region Tappet Clatter go paperless?

At the Board of Directors meeting it was reported that for the last two or three years our bank balance has continued to decline. The big hitter is the cost of printing and mailing the Tappet Clatter. It was obvious to the Board that we could almost balance the budget by sending the Tappet Clatter by email instead of paying to have it printed and mailed. We paid \$154.00 last month (that would be \$1848.00 per year) to print and mail the TC. That is about \$2.05 per person per month (\$24.10 per year). We all realize some members would prefer to receive it by mail but that would require a raise in dues or more fundraisers or both. There are a small number of members who do not have email, Al Howe volunteered to print and mail to them.

Thanks to the help from our editor, Mike Currie, and our new web master, Ralf Luche, we have worked out a plan to make this work. We will discuss this more at the February meeting but it would be helpful to know what <u>all members</u> would prefer. Would you prefer to continue receiving the TC by mail and increase our dues by about \$24.00 a year (\$2 per month) or would you being willing to receive the TC by email? Since all members can't attend all meetings I would like your response to this question by email so we can have that information available at the February meeting.

You can just do a **reply** to this email and say "email" or "printed copy" or email me at chevyal@comcast.net or call me.

There are some advantages to this change:

- 1) We don't have to raise dues.
- 2) You will receive the Tappet Clatter a little sooner.
- 3) You can print only the pages you want.
- 4) If you have a color printer you can have a colored copy.

There are some disadvantages:

- 1) You have to read it on the computer or print it yourself.
- 2) You must remember to check your email.

# 1949-54 passenger car starter

Little is known about the 1949-54 Chevrolet passenger car starter.

Starting in 1949 Chevrolet passenger cars started using a pushbutton/solenoid actuated type starter. This was a two field style starter, which was used on all 1949-54 manual transmission cars (see picture 1). With the introduction of the Powerglide transmission in 1950, Chevrolet decided they needed a stronger starter to turn over the engine with its heavy transmission torque converter attached. So in 1950 Chevrolet introduced the 4-field starter for this application. (Sorry, no picture, but the second "shoes" in picture 1 would also have windings around them). This is a fairly rare starter as most parts stores did not show a difference in the two applications, and would just give you what they had on the shelf. This 4-field starter is not even mentioned in the 1954 or earlier GM parts books. I do not have a 1955 GM parts book, but my 1956 is the first book that shows the Powerglide starter separate from the manual transmission starter.

There are two ways to identify the 2 and 4 field starters. The first is by the tag on the side of the starter. The problem with this is that a lot of starters are missing the tag. There also appears to be a number of different tag numbers for the 2-field starter. There are three that I have found, 1107075, 1107109, and 1118135.

I have only found one number for the 4 field starter, 1118035.

The second way to identify a 2 or 4-field starter is by the position of the terminal coming out of the field

housing, (there is a copper strap from this post to the solenoid). The 2 field starter will have the terminal coming out of the housing next to an open area of the housing (see picture 2).

The 4 field starter will have the terminal next to a solid area of housing (picture 3.

If your car is starting fine for you do not worry about the difference between the two starters, but if you find your car turns over slowly, this would be a good place to start checking.
