

# **Director's Corner**

"From The Running Board"





Hello Club Members,

Jerry and I are looking forward to serving you this next year. We are pleased that we are surrounded by such a great group of leaders. We also will appreciate the help we receive from each of you this next year. It will be needed to accomplish our club activities and goals.

Why is this being written "from the running board"? As many of you know, my ankylosing spondylitis has resulted in two heart valve replacement surgeries which have compromised my heart pumping action. This in turn causes reduced oxygen in my blood which causes further reduction in heart muscle function, body muscle strength, and shortness of breath. It is called congestive heart failure. I learned this summer at South Lake Tahoe, 6000 ft. elevation, that the thinner air makes it very difficult to get enough oxygen to walk normally. A running board is an exciting place for me to ride with my face in the wind, enjoying the view and looking to the future. Also, the running board provides a place to sit and rest or to just get off and sit by the road and enjoy the scenery. So, if you see me slowed down, I invite you to come alongside and help with what needs to happen.

I am looking forward to all of us having a great New Year as we work together.






November 28, 2016

<u>Call to Order</u>: The meeting was called to order at Ringdall Middle School at 7:30 by Director Jim Darby. We had 25 members present and no guests. There will not be a December Christmas Party this year because no-one wished to host it or organize it on short notice. As a result there will be no December Tappet Clatter giving Mike Currie a break for the holidays. The next meeting will be the January Banquet at the Golden Steer in Kent. Send banquet registrations to Sallie Comstock, 6608 183<sup>rd</sup> Ave. East, Lake Tapps, WA 98391. There will be no regular meeting here in Bellevue until February.

Minutes: The minutes from the October meeting were approved as published.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Sallie reported the treasury is healthy with the renewals from last month. The only outstanding bill is for the room rental to Bellevue Schools. A report was given outlining the expenses for 2016 which was a bit less than we have in the treasury to take us through 2017.

<u>Membership</u>: Donna Onat updated us on our membership. We will be starting the year with about 75 member families which is the same as last year. She is completing the data for the 2017 roster and finishing up a couple of loose ends.

<u>Activities</u>: Rod Schein is taking part in the train event along with Ralf Luche. They are back at their church from 9 A.M. to 2P.M. on December 18<sup>th</sup>. There will be trains in one room and seasonal goodies served in another.

Cover Story: Kathy Currie penned the very well written article highlighting the Mahogany and Merlot Tour in September.

<u>National News</u>: The National organization is losing its member services staff very soon and have sent out requests for bids to take over the job. This is the business office, taking care of the roster, mailing information for the G&D, handling inquiries and complaints on a daily basis. Bill is also creating space on the web site for the "Best of the Best" offerings for this year, a challenging process of selecting from the winners who submit 10 photos of their "Best of Show".

Possible locations for the 2021 National Meet are being visited with the list being narrowed considerably.

Portland Swap Meet tickets are now available on line at a discount. \$7 per day or if you buy four or more they are \$5 each.

Mt Rainier Region News: The Mt. Rainier Region has been going through a difficult time this fall losing half its officers as well as about half its membership. As a result they don't feel they are nor will be in a position to host the 2018 Northwest Meet. We discussed possible ways we could help from moving up our hosting year to having a Mini-Meet type get-together possibly in Centralia. We also would like to welcome any of the Mt. Rainier members to our Region.

Glove Box: Nothing new this month. Let Bob know if you have issues you need researched.

Monroe Swap Meet: After discussing the issues we decided to continue working at Monroe if asked.

<u>2017 Northwest Meet</u>: Jim Darby asked us not to book a room at the Casino for a couple of weeks to give the North Cascades Region a chance to resolve an issue with the room rates. Our group rate is higher than their regular AARP rate which may mess up their guaranteed number of rooms. You should be good to go in January.

Thank you Dave.

#### Slow turning when cold:

Battery cables are too small.

Bad electrical connections.

Battery charge or condition is poor.

Starter problems.

#### **Slow turning when hot:**

Engine timed too fast.

Hot air expansion gives higher compression.

Expansion of pistons. (Warm aluminum pistons expand and put light pressure on cylinder walls).

Starter brushes, higher resistance in wires, etc.

Battery not fully charged or in poor condition.

Battery cables too small, bad electrical connections.

Engine temperature rises after shut-down (for a short period) gives higher compression and higher piston friction to cylinder wall.

#### Turns over but won't start:

Coil not getting enough voltage while cranking, due to starter drawing high current.

Engine is flooded.

Choke not closing or sticking closed.

Accelerator pump not working.
