



We're not the cause.


But don't be afraid To get out of bed; There's got to be Better weather ahead.

He asked Dick for a list of those things. Now that MG has a '53 Chevrolet and I realize that I cannot get it on my little trailer for our '26 Touring, I have a greater interest in this list of items to hopefully get us home.

Here is the list:

Fan belt Front wheel bearing Fuel pump RTV gasket maker

Water pump Tape – electrical and masking

Coil Cotter pins
Dist. Cap Baling wire
Condenser Nuts and bolts
Points and rotor Accelerator spring

Spark plugs Tow rope

Generator brushes Gallon 50-50 antifreeze/ water

Voltage regulator Oil- 1 qt.

Fuel filter Fender protective cover Fuel rubber hose (2 ft) Clamps for fuel line

Bulbs Hand cleaner

Wire – electrical (10 ft) Paper shop towels

The Locks were formally dedicated July 4, 1917.

They were listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1978.

The Locks were built by Seattle and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to develop the City of Seattle and as a commercial navigation route connecting Puget Sound to the Lake Washington Ship Canal.

The Locks are the nation's busiest; 50,000 vessels a year 'lock through'.

500,000 fish, including endangered salmon species, must pass through the Locks, spillway or fish ladder to move between Lake Washington and Puget Sound.

Carl S. English, Jr., 43 yr. horticulturist, landscaped the romantic English gardens with 570 species and 1500 plant varieties.

The Locks attract over 1.3 million visitors per year.
