

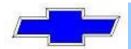

Traveling 405 from either the north or south, take exit 10 and head east to 119th St (should be the first stop light east of 405). From I-90 take the 405 South Exit and immediately stay to the right, getting off at the Coal Creek Parkway exit. (Note: you'll never actually merge onto 405.) Turn left under the freeway and take a right at the light on 119th. Go up the hill, passing through a couple of stop signs and turn right on SE 60th. The shopping center will be on your left. Follow SE 60th and Ringdall will be on your right. The meeting place for monthly PSVCCA meetings will be at Tillicum/Ringdall School Library (not the cafeteria).



Radiator Debris, Axle Seals and Sun Power

Radiator Cleaning

Dick Olson was tending to his 50's Chevrolet when he realized the bottom of his radiator was packed with foreign material. Dick warns that others may find the same thing. This blocked part of the radiator, reducing the radiator's ability to cool the engine. So check the bottom of your radiator for debris to ensure maximum cooling.

Axle Seals for 1920's and 1930's Chevrolets

These cars had felt where you would expect an axle seal on the rear axles. This often lead to leakage. Lewis McFadden came up with a solution to prevent the rear end oil from reaching the brakes. He uses NAPA axle seal number 13418 (or CRW11R) and embeds it in a black gasket making silicon, like NAPA Black RTV Silicone Rubber Auto Sealant. The embedded seal is bolted in place for a couple of days to ensure the seal is centered on the axle and the sealant solidified. Lewis has had these on his car since 2002 without an issue.

I had installed sealed bearings on my '26 hoping this would eliminate the gear end lube from reaching the brakes. When I recently pulled my brake drums, I found some, not much, but enough, oil so I will be taking this extra step of using NAPA seals.


Solar Destruction

I noticed the upholstery in my '26, which was marine grade naugahyde had a small melted spot on it. I surmised that this was the result of a chemical like nail polish remover. Then one sunny day when the car was sitting in our driveway with the top down, I noticed a multicolored spot on the upholstery like it was refracted from somewhere. It was a hot spot. It took awhile but I found that it was refracted from my rear view mirror that had beveled edges. This can be very destructive, so be careful when your top is down that you are not getting a refracted beam onto your upholstery that can melt it, or possibly even cause a fire. It is like the old trick of starting a piece of paper on fire with a magnifying glass.

And finally, Bob says.....

I just received flyer from Costco that Battery Tender, battery charger and maintainer, 3 amp will go on sale for \$30 with Instant Savings on November 17th to 22nd. Works on 6 Volt and 12 Volt systems. 'Tis the season. I see what appears to be the same thing on Amazon for \$52.
